The petitioner, who had applied for appointment as Secretariat Assistant vide advertisement No.22/99, has moved this court for a direction to the Bihar Public Service Commission to issue the marks sheet of the petitioner without any delay as he has already made an application for the same.

It has further been contended by the learned counsel for the petitioner that the petitioner is not in know of the fact why his candidature has been rejected, as he neither knows the cut off mark up to which the candidates have been recommended nor he knows his marks to satisfy himself that he has obtained lesser marks.

In this regard, it has been contended that no transparency is shown by the respondent-B.P.S.C. and as was the procedure earlier, the entire list of successful and unsuccessful candidates used to be published with marks they have obtained against their roll numbers, why this practice has been given a go-by has not been explained?

Yesterday when the matter was taken up Mr. D.K. Sinha, learned senior counsel appearing on behalf of the B.P.S.C. had prayed for one day's adjournment and today on instruction, he has submitted that after his discussion with the Chairman, a decision
