The patitioner, would like to have a find direction that the examination which was s neduled on 17 November, 2002 by the Bihar Fublic Service Commission to for the post of *ccounts Officer in the Bihar Accounts Service should be restrained. This is not possible today. The examination has been held. The Court cannot put the clock back.

Further, the petitioner quarrels that the qualifications as were mentioned in the advertisement by which he had also applied, he is also qualified to take the examination. The advertisement mentioned that the candidates must

possess a graduate degree in commerce, a graduate degree in mathametics or a graduate degree in economics and statistics from a recognised institution of Indian and foreign Universities. Further, the candidtes having the degree of commerce with Chartered or cost Accountancy will be given a preference.

The contention of the petitioner is that he is a graduate and was qualified to apply for the examination. A closer look at the petitioner's degree shows that he is a graduate with Physics Honours with subsidiary subjects as Chemistry and Mathametics. This is not answering the advertisement. On this the Court is not also satisfied. The Court does not find any error in the order on the writ petiton.

This Letters Patent Appeal is misconceived. (SA)
